CEI's Manganese Removal Treatment Facility Breaks Ground

CEI is pleased to announce that construction of the Town of Kingston Manganese Removal Treatment Facility has initiated. This will be the Town's first water filtration facility with its primary purpose to remove manganese from the water from Trackle Pond Well. The 1.5 mgd facility will treat water using pressure filtration containing anthracite and GreensandPlus media. The project will include the installation of photovoltaic panels on the facility roof and other energy efficient innovations.

Construction of the project is being funded in part through the Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) as administered by the Massachusetts Water Pollution Abatement Trust and Department of Environmental Protection. CEI completed design and permitting of the facility and is currently providing construction administration services that will include assistance during facility startup which is anticipated to occur during the Spring of 2014.
