Recently, CEI Principal Engineer Matt Lundsted, P.E., CFM, was part of a training session to promote a Vernal Pool Mapping Project in the Town of Peterborough, NH. The Vernal Pool Mapping Project is an initiative by the Peterborough Conservation Commission and the Harris Center to identify vernal pools on town-owned land and conservation property.
