



CEI's Manganese Removal Treatment Facility Featured on PACTV

The Town of Kingston's Manganese Removal Treatment Facility was the focus of a PACTV segment on June 13, 2013. Commissioner Robert Kostka and Superintendent Matthew Darsch are featured in the interview. Construction of the facility will occur from June 2013 through June 2014. Comprehensive Environmental Inc. (CEI) completed the facility design and will be involved through construction and startup of this featured facility.

The proposed treatment facility will remove Manganese from the Town's Trackle Pond Well utilizing pressure filtration with GreensandPlus media. The facility has design capacity of 1.5 mgd and has been pro-actively designed with space for an additional filter for treatment of an additional future source. In keeping with the Town's designation as a Green Community, the facility is being designed with energy efficiency innovations and will include a solar power system with photovoltaic panels located on the roof of the facility. Construction of the project is being funded in part through the Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) as administered by the Massachusetts Water Pollution Abatement Trust and Department of Environmental Protection. CEI is providing design, construction and funding administration services.
