
CEI Talks SWMI at 2015 NEWEA Annual Conference



At the end of January CEI participated in the New England Water Environment Association (NEWEA) Annual Conference in Boston, MA. Senior Environmental Scientist Jessica Cajigas presented 'Leveraging Resources to Meet SWMI (Sustainable Water Management Initiative)' in a session focusing on watershed management. The presentation focused on finding SWMI mitigation credits within existing municipal programs and infrastructure improvements. Ms. Cajigas also moderated a session on 'Breaking News from the Regulatory Community'.



SWMI is a framework for permitting water supplies that intends to balance the needs of water for both human use and aquatic habitat protection. SWMI was developed by the Executive Office of Energy and Environmental Affairs (EEA) to address the long term sustainability of Massachusetts water resources.
